Students' fundamental rights under FERPA include:

- The right to inspect and review their educa
- The right to have some control over the disc records
- The right to request to amend inaccurate ed
- The right to be no fied on an annual basis o
- The right to file complaints with the Departr of the College to comply with the act.

FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to the rights transfer to the student when they reach the alearning. Records may be released to parents withounder certain exceptions. These exceptions may income

- Health or safety emergency
- Where the student has been found in viola relaing to the use of alcohol or a controlled of 21
- By submission of evidence that the parents of most recent Federal Income Tax form

The release to parents of educa on records under any of these excep ons is a permissible but not a required release. Thus, under FERPA, an insitution is not required to disclose information on from the student's education records to any parent of a dependent student. It may, however, exercise its discretion to do so.

If, a erinspec ng and reviewing their records, the student has any ques ons about them, they may request an oral or writen explana on and interpreta on of them.

Certain student records are not included among "educa onal records" under FERPA regula ons:

• Private notes or records held by educa onal personnel and not accessible to or revealed

- The College reserves the right to furnish to parents or guardians of financially dependent students any informa on relaing to such students' academic and social status. The College will assume that an undergraduate student is financially independent unless the student informs the Registrar's O ce otherwise.
- The records of a student may be disclosed without their writ en consent to comply with a judicial order or subpoena. In these instances, the College will make a reasonable e ort to no fy the student of this disclosure.
- The records of a student may be disclosed without their writ en consent in a health or safety emergency, as provided by law.
- Personally iden fiable informa on within educa on records may be released to various auditors (federal, state and private) without prior consent.
- Educa on records may be disclosed to the At orney General in response to an exparte court order as part of an inves ga on or prosecu on related to poten al terrorism in order to comply with the USA Patriot Act.

The following informa on related to a student is considered "directory informa on" and the College reserves the right to disclose it without the student's consent unless the student informs the Registrar's O ce on forms available electronically or in the O ce of the Registrar that any or all such informa on about them self is not to be made public without their writ en permission:

- Full name
- Addresses (including home, local and email)
- Telephone numbers
- Date and place of birth
- Major field of study
- Par cipa on in o cially recognized ac vi es and sports including weight and height of
- Members of athle c teams
- Dates of at endance
- Degrees and awards received
- Most recent previous educa onal ins tu on at ended by the student
- Enrollment status (full- or part- me)
- Class (e.g. first-year, sophomore, junior, senior)
- The tle of their master's project or doctoral disserta on
- Dis nguished academic performance (e.g., Dean's List)

An educa on record, without consent, can be returned to the party iden fied as the party that created the record. The regula ons would also permit a state or local educa onal en ty to redisclose educa on records without consent to the school district that provided the informa on.

To conform with the requirements of the Campus Sex Crimes Preven on Act, the regula ons permit campus o cials to release informa on to A t re ul o re
